D. GOOD TO REMEMBER ●●●

When the water of the **Jordan River** was low, people could use a ford to cross the river. John baptized at Bethabara. This name means "house of the ford." Because the road crossed the Jordan River at this place, there were always a lot of people. In spring, the Jordan River often overflowed. The riparian zone became a swamp and the animals were expelled. In the **synagogue**, Jesus stood to read. Every male Israelite was entitled to do so. The Law and the prophets were read in a standing position. The rabbi remained sitting when he explained the words that had been read. The women were separated from the men in the synagogue. They were behind a partition, so they were hardly visible to the men.

MEMORIZE

8. THE ARRANGEMENT OF THE TABERNACLE

1. The dimensions

The tabernacle was 10 cubits high (approximately 5 meters), 11 cubits wide, and 30 cubits long (approximately 15 meters).

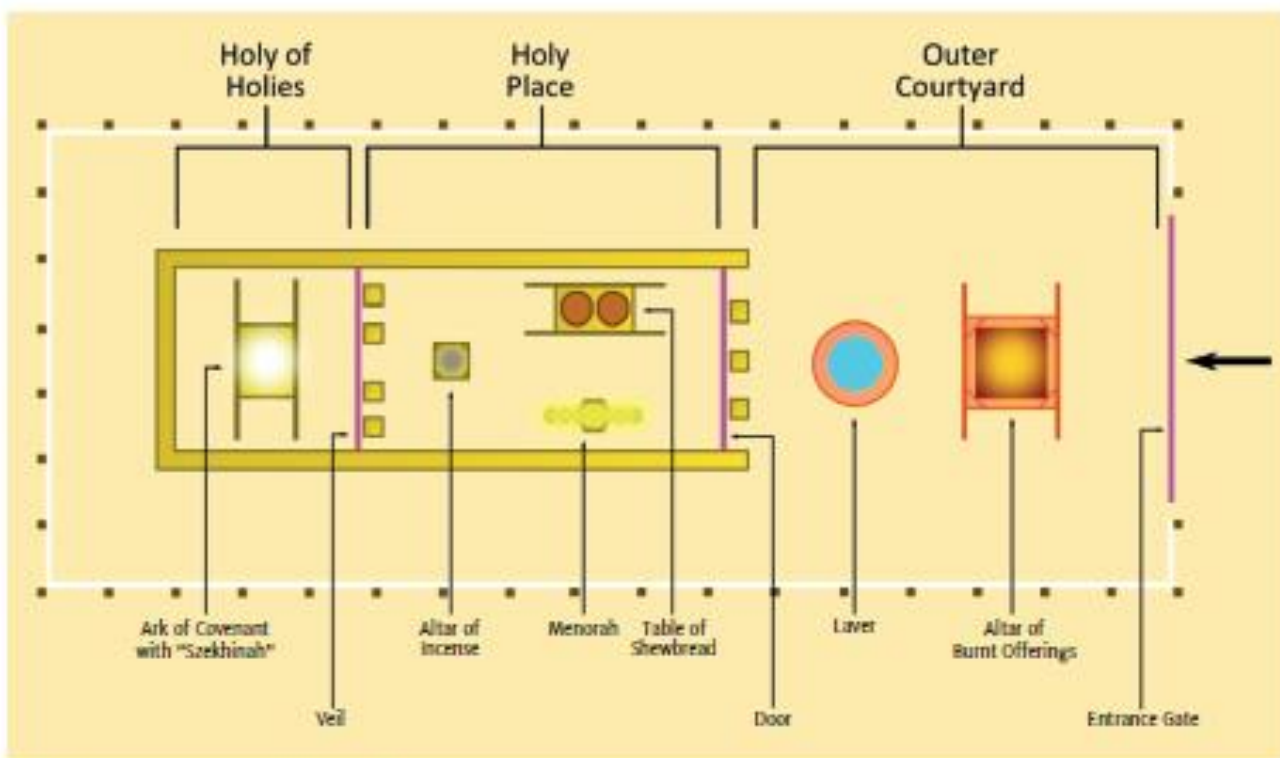
Lengthwise, the tabernacle was divided into 2 unequal parts: the Holy Place was 20 cubits long (approximately 10 meters) and the Holy of Holies was 10 cubits long. This made the Holy of Holies a cube of 10x10x10 cubits (= 5x5x5 meters).

2. What was in the tabernacle?

There were two rooms in the tabernacle:

1. The Holy Place, with the table with the shewbread, the golden candlestick, and the golden altar of incense.
2. The Holy of Holies, with the ark and with the mercy seat.

The court surrounded the tabernacle. Here the altar of burnt offering and the laver were found.



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
